

Resource Management System Alternative

What is a Resource Management System Alternative?

A Resource Management System is a conservation plan that identifies all the resources to be managed, all the problems to be addressed, and all the conservation practices that will be needed.

Typically, it is not feasible to do everything at once. But developing the conservation plan as a complete Resource Management System helps set priorities and a logical sequence of implementation.

Many conservation practices will be used to address more than one resource problem. For example, brush management can be used to improve forage production, reduce runoff and erosion, and reduce the risk of catastrophic wildfires.

Thinking through all the needs up front will help make sure every conservation practice is designed and installed to maximize the benefits and reduce overall costs.
